FALL CLEAN UP

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 17 - SATURDAY, OCTOBER 24, 2020

Keep Hopewell Beautiful in partnership with the Hopewell Public Works Department has scheduled Fall Citywide Clean-up from Saturday, October 17, to Saturday, October 24, 2020.

Hours of operation during "Fall Clean-Up" at the Citizen Convenience Center are 12:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday-Friday, and Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Citizens are encouraged to participate in this effort by cleaning around their homes and along their streets. During this week, Hopewell residents may dispose of trash at no charge at the Citizen Convenience Center located at 507 Station Street, behind Fire Station #1. There will be the usual \$10.00 fee for the removal of Freon to dispose of appliances.

The following items will not be accepted at the Citizen Convenience Center: concrete, masonry, garbage (items normally disposed of in your trash toter), and paint of any kind, batteries, automobile motors, and hazardous waste materials. Tires are limited to four (4) per citizen, and they must be separated from the rim. There can be no more than eight (8) tires per household.

Firestone Tire located in the Cavalier Square Shopping Center is collaborating with the City and will accept up to four (4) tires per person and batteries (no limit) during Fall Clean-Up Week. Remember, "Fall Clean-Up" activities apply to Hopewell residents only.

Please be aware that for the safety of citizens and residents 6 feet social distancing will be required at all times. Additionally, Public Works staff will not assist citizens with any unloading of materials from vehicles.



Governor Northam Announces Additional Funding for Rent and Mortgage Relief

~ Successful program is helping both residents and landlords to stay current on rent and mortgage payments ~



Governor Ralph Northam announced that the Virginia Open Data Portal now includes more than a dozen new COVID-19 datasets from the Virginia Department of Health.

The launch of the new Virginia Open Data Portal, which is a collaboration between the Office of the Chief Data Officer and the Library of Virginia, was accelerated amid the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic to provide greater access to the data informing public health officials and allow Virginians to interact with it.

"Every day this public health crisis reminds us why data is one of the most valuable resources in state government," said Governor Northam. "Our goal is to harness data to promote efficiency, increase transparency, and develop innovative solutions to the challenges we face. This expansion of the Virginia Open Data Portal will make the data driving our decisions available to all Virginians and empower people across the Commonwealth to engage in our ongoing COVID-19 response and recovery efforts."

The Virginia Open Data Portal was launched in 2014 by Governor Terry McAuliffe to provide centralized access to data across state agencies and create a platform where Virginians can interpret, analyze, and transform the data into actionable intelligence. Within the portal, users can view stories and dashboards, create visualizations, filter data, and access it through application programming interfaces (APIs) to build solutions in web and mobile applications. "Secure and appropriate data sharing is fundamental to the success of our society because information supports engagement," said Chief Data Officer Carlos Rivero. "The Commonwealth's data is a strategic asset that when leveraged, can drive innovation, increase quality of life, and stimulate economic growth."

The [2020 Virtual Virginia Datathon](#), which kicks off today, October 1, will bring together state agencies, students, localities, non-profits, and private sector businesses to leverage

this data to develop innovative solutions that seek to address challenges created by the pandemic. The Datathon will be livestreamed on the [Library of Virginia's YouTube](#) page beginning at 8:30 a.m. on October 1. Team presentations are scheduled for 2:00 p.m. on October 2.

The annual Virginia Datathon, which is being held virtually this year, is a two-day statewide competition where teams of innovators use state data and other open data sources to create applications with the support of subject matter experts from the community.

In previous years, Datathon participants have tackled issues from workforce innovation, to equity in education, to the opioid and addiction crisis.

"The pandemic delivered unique and unprecedented challenges for many, and it's important that we respond to this crisis and move toward recovery in ways that are equitable for each community," said Sandra Treadway, Librarian of Virginia. "The far-reaching theme of this year's Datathon will invite participants to explore the multi-faceted challenges brought on by COVID-19 and develop solutions that can mitigate the impacts of this crisis and ultimately aid Virginia's recovery."

In June, Governor Northam [announced the expansion](#) of the Framework for Addiction Analysis and Community Transformation (FAACT), Virginia's cross-agency, cloud-based, data-sharing and analytics platform to help the Commonwealth mitigate the spread of COVID-19 and maintain an adequate supply of resources.

The Commonwealth is committed to growing the number of open datasets available through the portal. Learn more about the Virginia Open Data Portal and access the Commonwealth's datasets at data.virginia.gov.



Fire Prevention Week 2020- Oct 4-10 2020
Serve up Fire Safety in the Kitchen

Cooking remains the # 1 cause of fires.

- 1) Never leave cooking unattended-remain alert while cooking.
- 2) Always have a lid handy when cooking.
- 3) Keep the area around the cooktop clear.
- 4) Same rules apply when using grills!
- 5) Every home should have working smoke detectors and fire extinguishers!



Cooking Safety

Cooking brings family and friends together, provides an outlet for creativity and can be relaxing. But did you know that cooking fires are the number one cause of home fires and home injuries? By following a few safety tips you can prevent these fires.

"COOK WITH CAUTION"

- Be on alert! If you are sleepy or have consumed alcohol don't use the stove or stovetop.
- Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, boiling, grilling, or broiling food. If you leave the kitchen for even a short period of time, turn off the stove.
- If you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly, remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer to remind you that you are cooking.
- Keep anything that can catch fire — oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains — away from your stovetop.

If you have a small (grease) cooking fire and decide to fight the fire...

- On the stovetop, smother the flames by sliding a lid over the pan and turning off the burner. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled.
- For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed.

If you have any doubt about fighting a small fire...

- Just get out! When you leave, close the door behind you to help contain the fire.
- Call 9-1-1 or the local emergency number from outside the home.

Cooking and Kids

Have a "kid-free zone" of at least 3 feet (1 metre) around the stove and areas where hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

FACTS

- ! The leading cause of fires in the kitchen is unattended cooking.
- ! Most cooking fires in the home involve the kitchen stove.

Hopewell Recreation and Parks Receives Statewide Excellence Awards

Delegates from around the state gathered virtually this week at the 65th Annual Conference of the Virginia Recreation and Park Society. The conference provides an opportunity for recreation and park professionals to discuss areas of common interest, learn emerging trends in the industry, and acquire valuable professional development skills. Highlighting each year's conference is a formal presentation of awards. This statewide program honors individuals, departments and organizations throughout Virginia who have demonstrated excellence in any of several areas during the previous year. More than 90 applications were submitted vying for awards in 14 different categories. Judged by a jury of its peers, Hopewell Recreation and Parks was recognized in four categories. Awards received are listed below:

- **Best New Special Event Award – Jack-O-Lantern Jamboree**



- This Halloween celebration designed specifically for younger children and children with disabilities was held at the Hopewell Community Center and featured an indoor pumpkin patch, barrier-free obstacle course, messy classroom, spooky photo booth, and a variety of other family-friendly activities. The event served over 300 participants and was produced for less than \$600. The program was made possible through a partnership with Special Olympics Virginia.

- **Best New Facility Award (Parks, playgrounds, blueways, greenways, trails) – Hopewell Riverwalk**

- The Hopewell Riverwalk is a 1,736-foot boardwalk that follows the shoreline of the Appomattox River beginning at City Park. The \$620,000 project was the result of creative planning efforts and unique fundraising. The program was completed in partnership with Friends of the Lower Appomattox River and the HCA John Randolph Medical Center and is one of the most notable sections of the proposed Appomattox River Trail.

- **Best New Environmental Sustainability Award – Hopewell Restoration Project**



- Hopewell Recreation and Parks partnered with the Chesapeake Bay Foundation on the implementation of the Hopewell Restoration Project. Through the project, the two organizations celebrated the installation of 78 large trees at various sites across the city, including several park spaces. The two organizations also worked collaboratively to execute two invasive species removal projects and a rain garden refresh. The project aims to complete a variety of projects to improve environmental quality throughout the city while providing educational opportunities for citizens and local organizations.

- **Most Innovative Marketing Piece – Hopewell Recreation and Parks Website**

- To better communicate department information, Hopewell Recreation and Parks created its own website in an effort to improve efficiency. The website was built from the ground up at an initial cost of \$76. The website was designed internally by staff of the department who now maintain the site and update content on a daily basis.
