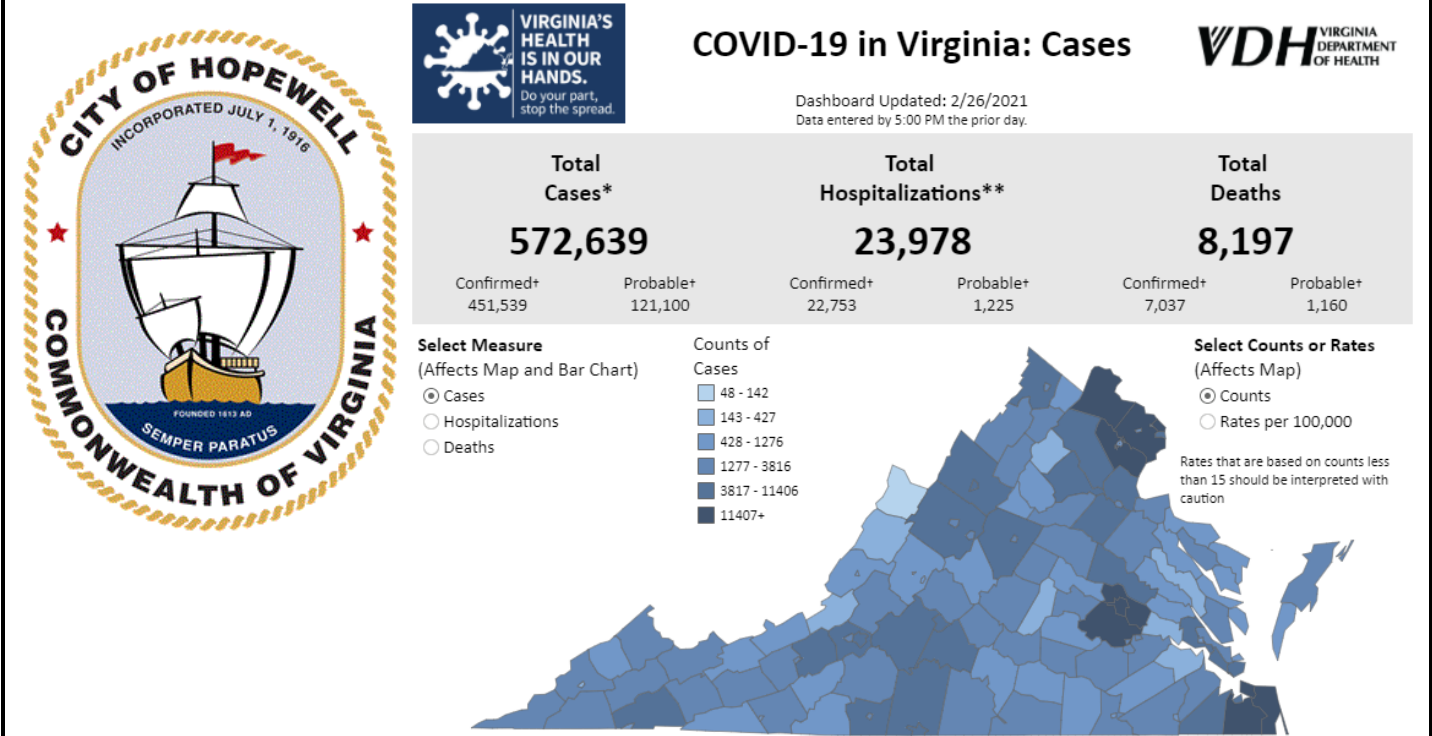

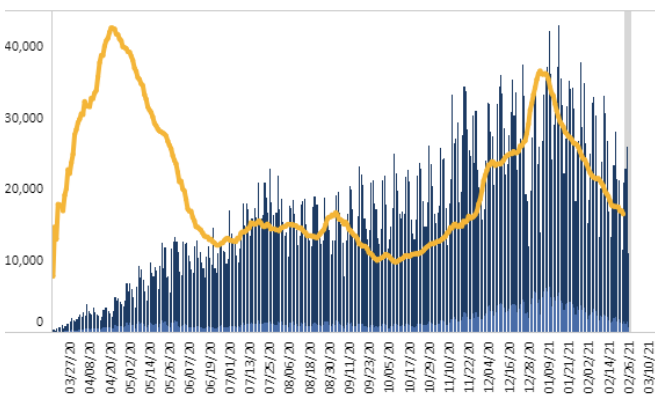

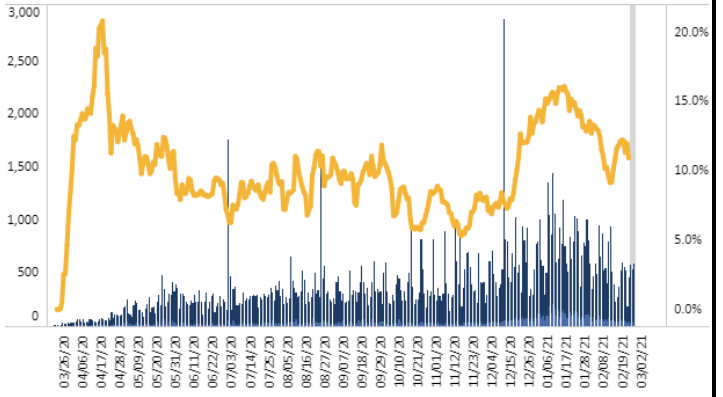
Number of Testing Encounters, Number of Positive Testing Encounters, and Percent Positivity** by Lab Report Date - All Health Districts, PCR Only

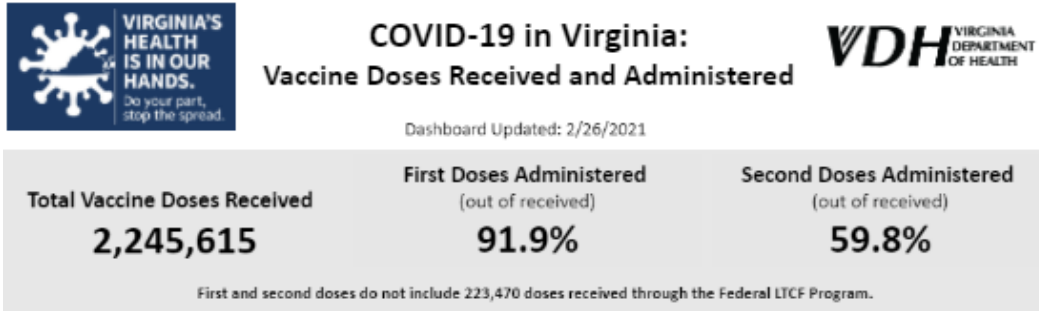

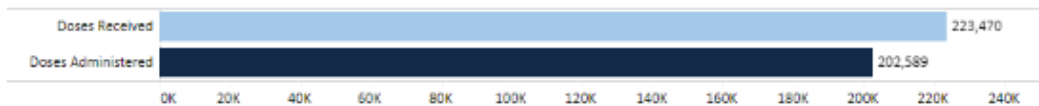

State Vaccination Dashboard:



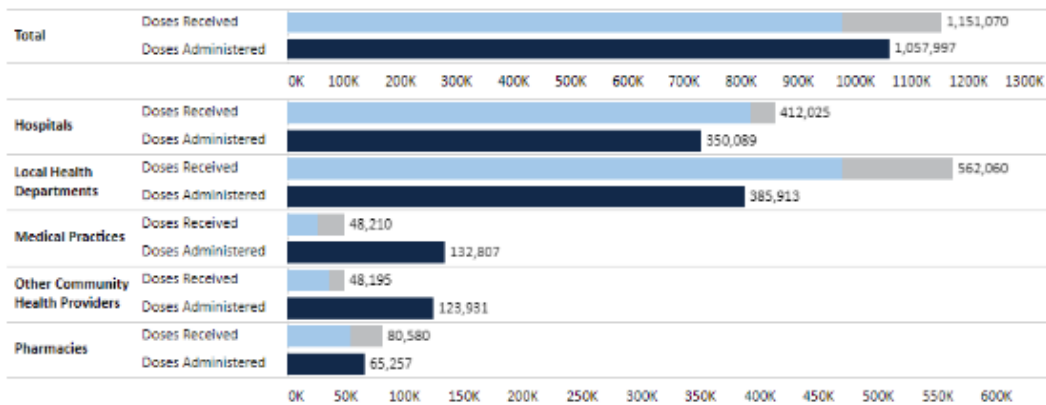
Federal Long-Term Care Facility (LTCF) Program Doses Administered and Received



Vaccine Received and Administered through Virginia's State COVID-19 Vaccination Program (Does not include Federal LTCF Program)

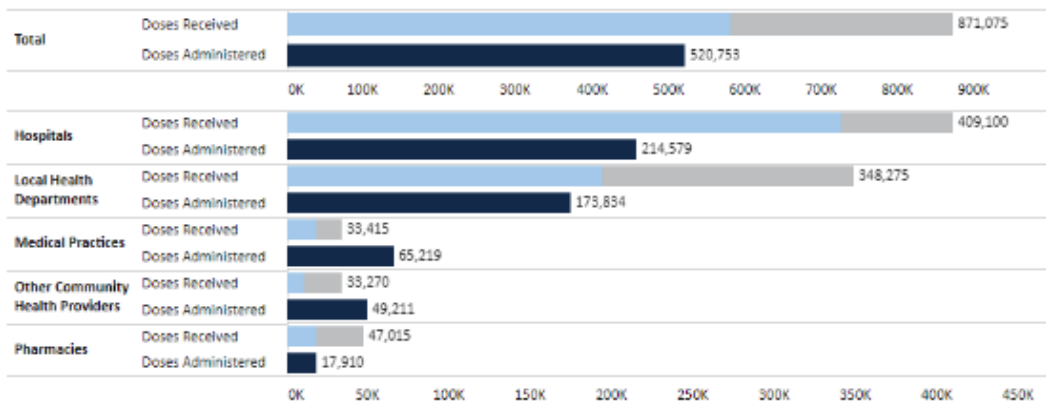
COVID-19 Vaccine Received and Administered by Facility Type and Dose*

First Doses

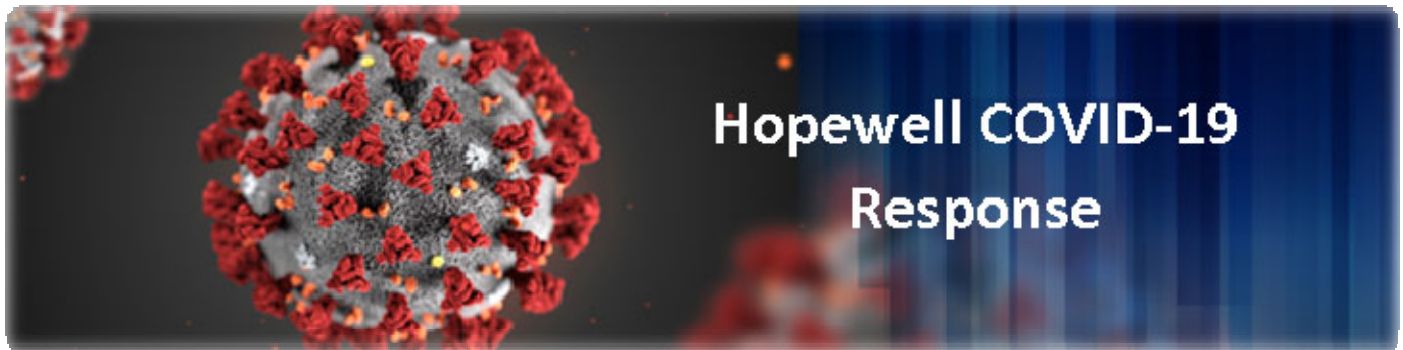

Critical Takeaways on Response in Central Virginia:

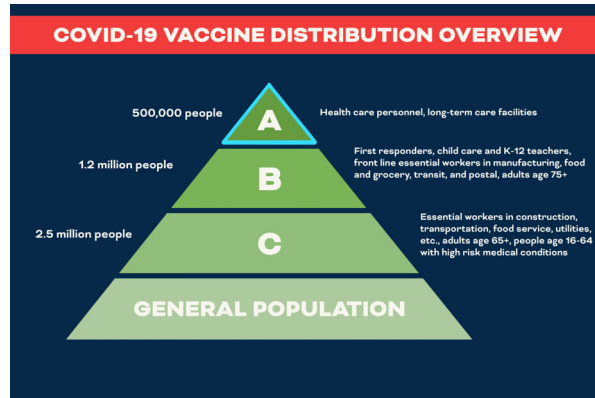
- **A vaccination event was conducted at Petersburg High School today that included residents of Hopewell, Prince George, Dinwiddie**
- **Vaccination event is scheduled from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM tomorrow 2/27/21 at 315 Cavalier Square. Appointments are full for this event. 2/26/21**
- **Hometown Drug will be hosting a pre-registration Vaccination event (already full) on Monday 3/1/21 at 315 Cavalier Square.**
- **The next testing event will be Tuesday March 9th from 10:00-12:00 at 400 Cavalier Square. 2/26/21.**
- **Wednesday Governor Northam Announced Changes to his COVID-19 executive orders effective March 1st 2021. The highlights of those changes are as follows:**
 - **Current Modified Stay at Home order will expire on February 28th**
 - **Social gatherings:** The maximum number of individuals permitted in a social gathering will increase from 10 to 25 people for outdoor settings, while remaining at 10 persons for indoor settings.
 - **Entertainment venues:** Outdoor entertainment and public amusement venues will be able to operate with up to 1,000 individuals or at 30 percent capacity, whichever is lower. If current trends continue, these venues may be able to operate at 30 percent capacity with no cap on the number of people permitted to attend starting in April. Indoor entertainment and public amusement venues must continue to operate at 30 percent capacity with a cap of 250 people. All entertainment venues were previously limited to a maximum of 250 individuals.
 - **Dining establishments:** The on-site sale, consumption, and possession of alcohol will be permitted until midnight, extended from 10:00 p.m. All restaurants, dining establishments, food courts, breweries, microbreweries, distilleries, wineries, and tasting rooms still must be closed between midnight and 5:00 a.m.
 - **Overnight summer camps:** As of May 1, overnight summer camps will be able to open with strict mitigation measures in place. Registration can begin now.

- **Storm preparations continued today across all departments. 2/17/21**
- **COVID-19 Vaccine –Virginia Statewide Pre-Registration System on line as of 2/16/2021**
- **COVID- 19 testing event cancelled for February 18, 2021.**
- **EOC activated and managed winter storm and water outage from 2/14/2021- 2/16/2021**
- **EOC prepared for activation and staffing identified. 2/12/2021**
- **Storm preparations continued today across all departments. 2/1/21**

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<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vaccination event Saturday canceled due to weather. 2/11/21 • Hopewell Vaccination Call Center went live today at 9:30. 2/10/21 • Planning for response operations to a possible Ice Storm this weekend while continuing vaccination planning simultaneously. 2/10/21 • Due to the Weather forecast and lack of registrants, the testing scheduled for Friday 2/12/2021 has been canceled. 2/10/21 • Another vaccination clinic for Hopewell / Prince George Schools will be conducted this Saturday from 2:00-5:00 PM at the old Gordman's building in Cavalier Square. 2/9/21 • Hopewell's vaccination call center is going live tomorrow morning at 9:30. The City will begin taking calls from the public and putting people qualified as 1b, on a waiting list for COVID-19 vaccination. 2/9/21 • Training conducted for call center personnel via ZOOM. 2/9/21 • The next scheduled testing event will be Friday, February 12th from 10:00-12:00. This is a Crater Health testing event. Pre-registration is required by calling 804-862-8989. 2/9/21 • Participated in a statewide vaccination support call hosted by VDEM. They laid out a process for communicating vaccination response information amongst local administrators and elected officials, as well as some ongoing planning efforts for some large vaccination sites across the state. 2/9/21 • Closed vaccination clinic for Hopewell / Prince George Schools completed on Saturday 2/6/2021 approximately 400 people vaccinated. • Work was completed on prepping the building, for the vaccination clinic, this Saturday at the old Gordman's building in Cavalier Square. 2/4/21 • Work continued on acquiring the human resources for the vaccination site Saturday. 2/4/21 • Training was conducted for call center takers. 2/4/21 • Work continued on prepping the building, and acquiring resources for the vaccination clinic, this Saturday at the old Gordman's building in Cavalier Square. 2/3/21 • Work continued on call center preparations as well. 2/3/21 • Old Gordman's site in Cavalier Square has been approved by Cavalier Square Management, as our vaccination site in the City. We are currently working through the process of getting it prepared for use, including cleaning, utilities etc. 2/2/21 • First Vaccination event in the City will be conducted this Saturday. It will closed to the public by invitation only. Crater Health is registering the priority groups that will be vaccinated at this site. 2/2/21 • Site visit conducted to possible vaccination site. 2/1/21 • Worked on logistics of the Hopewell Call center to support Crater Health District efforts. 2/1/21 • Next COVID testing will be conducted on Thursday February 4th at Cavalier Square from 10:00-12:00 2/1/21 • Crater Health District residents can register for the COVID-19 Vaccine waitlist for groups 1A and 1B here: https://redcap.vdh.virginia.gov/redcap/surveys/?s=7YYJJER4P8 • COVID testing conducted on Friday 1/29 at Cavalier Square – 29 people tested. • The Governor hosted a press briefing today. They key take-aways are as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ A new vaccine dashboard (see above) was launched today, enabling more transparency about where the state is in the vaccination process. ○ The state is currently averaging 26,000 vaccinations a day. ○ The next goal is 50,000 doses a day, but is subject to supply, which is dependent completely 			

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<p>on the Federal government, who has indicated that they can do some limited ramp up of supply to states immediately</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ All skilled nursing homes should have vaccinations complete by February 8th through the federal contract with CVS and Walgreens. The other assisted living facilities should be done by the end of February. ○ The governor announced new guidance on vaccine allocation within the 1b vaccination category. He has directed health departments to provide 50% of their allocation for 1b to go to essential workers, and the other 50% to go to those 65 and older, and those with pre-existing conditions. ○ He announced that he will be extending his current COVID-19 executive order restrictions through the end of February. ○ The temporary COVID standards developed for the workplace have been made permanent as of today. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Participated in Regional Conference Call with Crater Health today to discuss vaccination planning going forward. Key take-aways are below 1/25/21: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Currently Crater Health is using all of the vaccine they are receiving from the state working on groups 1A and starting into some 1B in their current closed POD method. ○ They are currently moving from the VAMS system for registration to Prep-Mod software. They will be moving the information currently in VAMS over, and registering new patients in Prep-MOD. ○ Plans are underway to expand vaccination efforts, but nothing can be implemented until more vaccine becomes available. ● Participated in the regional COVID-19 planning call today. 1/21/21 ● COVID Testing was conducted today in Cavalier Square. Details below: 1/21/21 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 67 Total Tested ○ 49 of which were Hopewell residents ● Next COVID testing session scheduled for Jan 21, 2021 1000-1200 at Cavalier Square. ● COVID-19 testing conducted tonight at Cavalier Square from 5:00-6:30. 71 People pre-registered for the testing. 57 were tested. Further details will be provided when the test results are complete. 1/14/21 ● Governor Northam held a press conference today. No significant changes were announced to the testing, vaccination, or mitigation strategies. 1/14/21 ● Access to VAMS was finally gained by Emergency Management. School nurses were uploaded into VAMS along with the other first responders for receiving vaccine. 1/12/20 ● Verification of City Staff that falls into category 1b for vaccination was begun today in preparation for the green light to get them uploaded into the system. 1/12/20 ● Fire and police are in the process of receiving Vaccinations. 1/8/21 ● Covid-19 testing took place today at Cavalier Square. 01/07/2021 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 97 Tested ○ Additional details pending data review ● Next Testing Event scheduled for Thursday 1/14/2021 5:00 pm- 6:30 pm at Cavalier Square. ● Governor's Office releases Vaccine Distribution model: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Group B includes frontline essential workers in specific industries, K-12 teachers and staff, childcare providers, adults age 75 and older, and people living in correctional facilities, homeless shelters, and migrant labor camps. 			

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- Group C includes other essential workers, adults age 65 and older, and people age 16-64 with certain medical conditions or disabilities that increase their risk of severe illness from COVID-19.



- Governors Press Conference on January 6, 2021- he discussed the goal is to provide vaccinations to the citizens of the Commonwealth based CDC guidelines. Priority groups have been established, with long-term care residents and health care workers as top priority. The goal is to have the general public completed with vaccinations by this summer.
- The Central RHCC activated today, and in Concert with VCU medical center, started performing patient distribution of EMS transports in the ODEMSA EMS region. This was due to the fact that a number of hospitals had gone on diversion. This only lasted about 5 hours before going back to normal status. 1/5/21
- Awaiting word on the availability of GENETWORx testing team for this week and the 3rd week of January.
- Crater Health Covid-19 Testing in Hopewell is scheduled for 1/14/2021, and 1/29/21.
