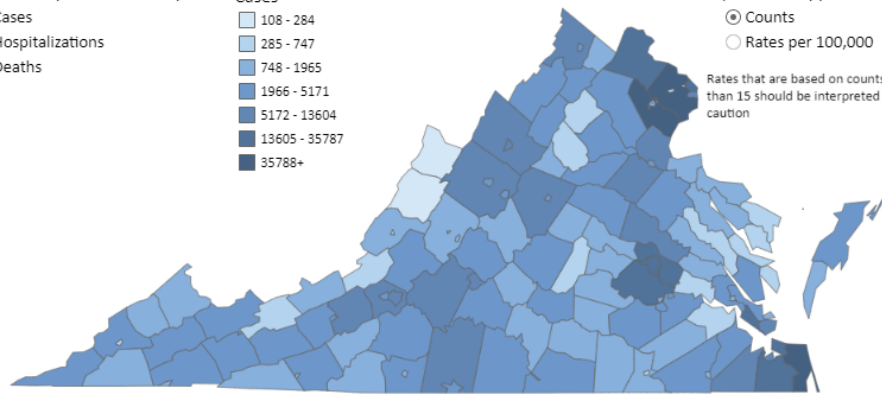

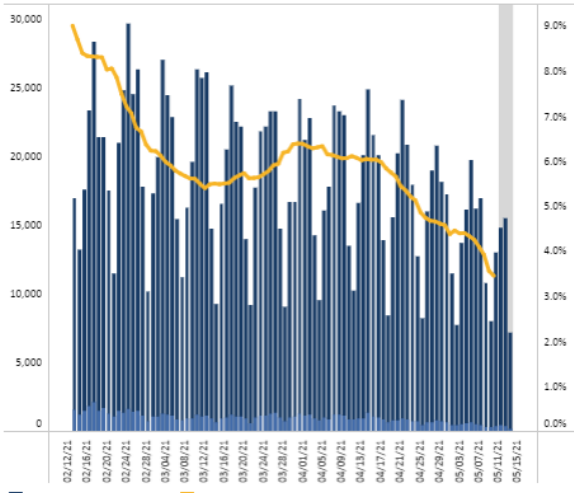

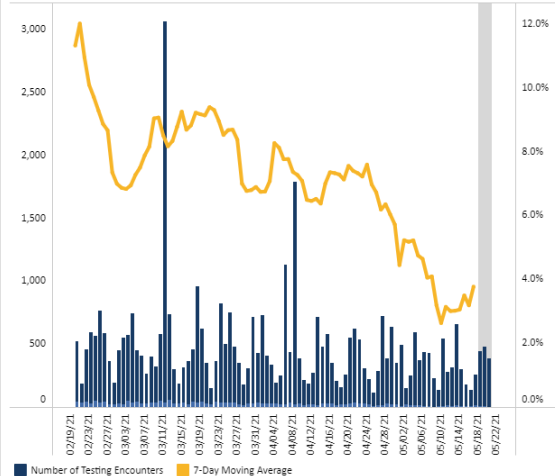

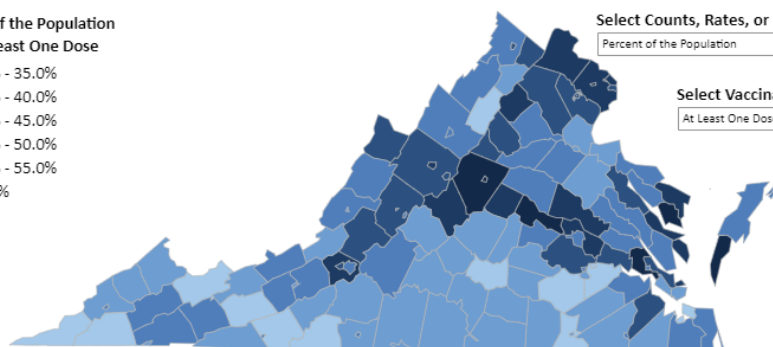

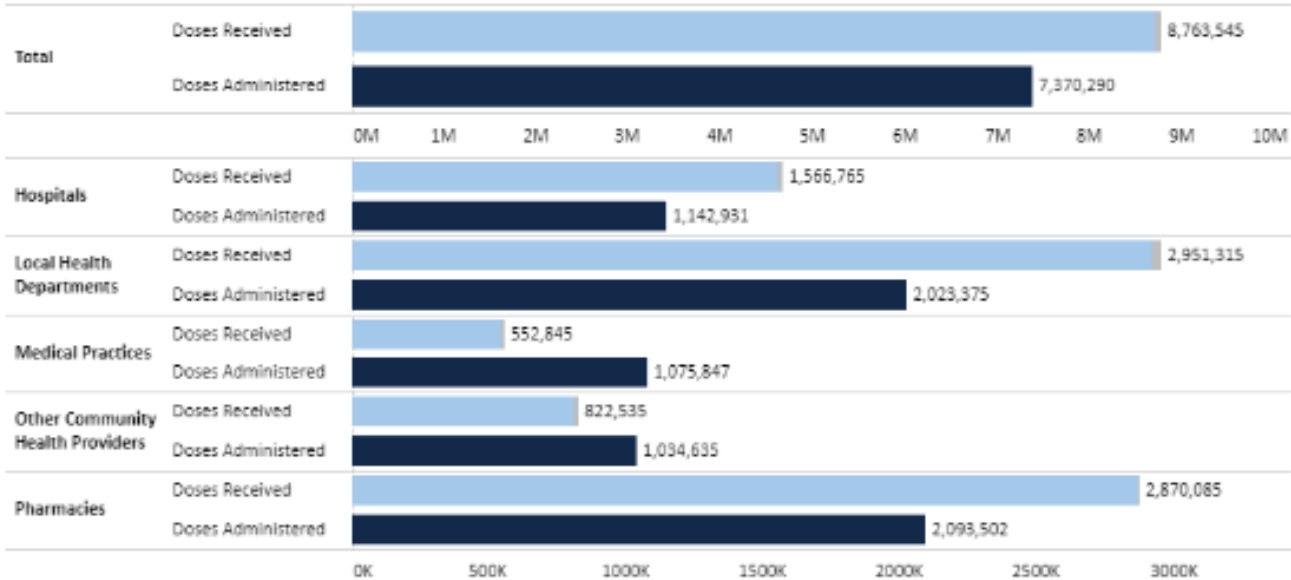

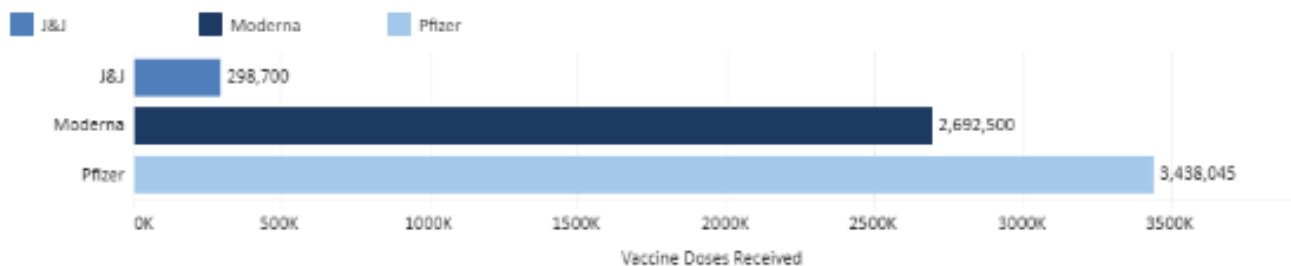

COVID-19 Vaccine Received and Administered by Facility Type*

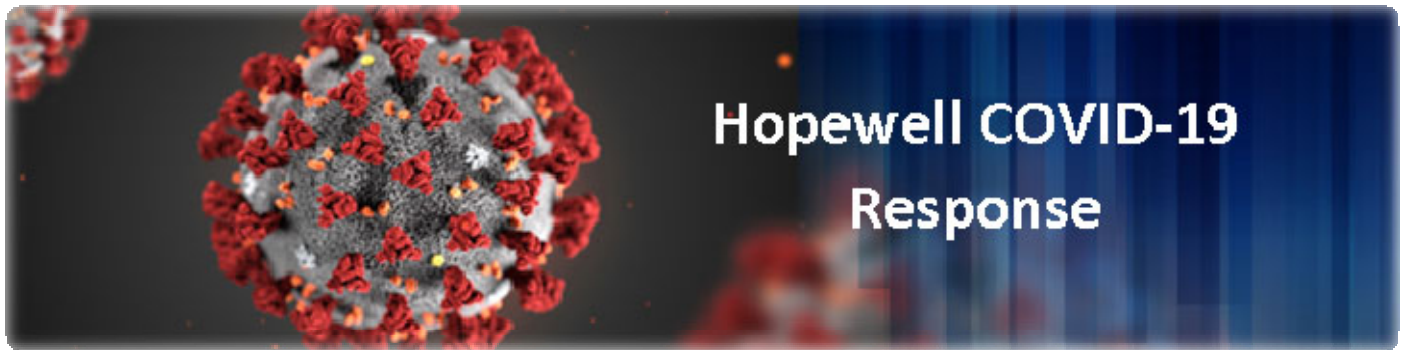

Critical Takeaways on Response in Central Virginia:

- The City hosted a vaccination clinic today (May 21st) from 09:00-1200 pm at 315 Cavalier Square (Gordman's). All three vaccines were used and 104 Vaccine doses were administered as part of this event.
- Upcoming- As of Midnight May 28, 2021 Governor Northam announced that Virginia will ease all distancing and capacity restrictions, two weeks earlier than planned.
- As of midnight, May 15 2021 persons who are fully vaccinated are no longer required to wear masks in accordance with Governors Executive Order 72 as amended. Further information is outlined here: <https://www.governor.virginia.gov/newsroom/all-releases/2021/may/headline-895235-en.html>
- The City's plan for re-opening/changes to restrictions will be announced on Monday 5/24.
- Hopewell School Children ages 12 and up who want to receive the Pfizer Vaccine in accordance with the new authorization from the FDA/CDC will be able to do so next week on Tuesday and Wednesday 5/25-5/26 at in-school vaccination clinics. Permission slips will need to be signed before vaccines are administered.
- The City hosted a vaccination clinic today (May 14th) from 09:00-2:30pm at 315 Cavalier Square (Gordman's). 158 Vaccine doses were administered as part of this event.
- FDA and CDC have approved EUA for Pfizer vaccines for ages 12-15. VDH has concurred with the limitation that vaccinators must receive specialized training on how to vaccinate this population before they can proceed. This training was scheduled to start after the clinic today at Gordman's. Therefore, no vaccines were administered to this age group at Gordman's on May 14, 2021.
- Several restriction established by the Governor's Executive Order 72 are changing as of 5:00 pm May 15 2021:
 - Social gatherings: The maximum number of individuals permitted in a social gathering will increase to 100 people for indoor settings and 250 people for outdoor settings. Social gatherings are currently limited to 50 people indoors and 100 people outdoors.
 - Entertainment venues: Indoor entertainment and public amusement venues will be able to operate at 50 percent capacity or 1,000 people, up from 30 percent capacity or 500 people. Outdoor venues will be able to operate at 50 percent capacity—up from 30 percent—with no specific cap on the number of attendees.
 - Recreational sporting events: The number of spectators allowed at indoor recreational sporting events will increase from 100 to 250 spectators or 50 percent capacity, whichever is less. Outdoor recreational sporting events will increase from

The Educate Vaccinate team did outreach in the surrounding area for both events. 10 Vaccines were administered as a result of these events. ● The City hosted a vaccination clinic today from 09:00-12:00pm at 315 Cavalier Square (Gordman’s). 117 Vaccine doses were administered as part of this event. ● Hopewell hosted a mobile vaccination clinic at the Davisville/Bland Court Community Center today from 2:00-4:00 PM doses of vaccine were administered. ● Hopewell hosted a mobile vaccination clinic at 100 Kippax (Kippax Place) on Wednesday April 28th from 1:00-4:00 PM. The Educate Vaccinate team conducted door-to-door outreach in the surrounding area before and during the event. 50 Doses of vaccine were administered. 4/30/21 ● Next week Hopewell will host two mobile clinics in the City on Tuesday April 4th. The first will be from The first will be from 10:00-12:00 pm at Piper Square Community Center, and the second from 2:00-4:00 pm at Thomas Rolfe Community Center. The Educate Vaccinate team will be used to do outreach in the surrounding area for both events. ● The City will also host a vaccination clinic next week on Friday April 7th from 09:00-12:00pm at 315 Cavalier Square (Gordman’s). ● On Thursday April 29th Governor Northam announced several changes to his executive orders in relation to the COVID-19 Pandemic. These included the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Executive Order Seventy-Two was amended to adopt new guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) on mask use in outdoor settings. The CDC guidelines state that fully vaccinated individuals do not have to wear masks outdoors when alone or in small gatherings. Mask use is still required indoors and outdoors at large crowded events like concerts, sporting events, and graduation ceremonies. People are considered fully vaccinated two weeks after receiving the last required dose of vaccine. ○ Executive Order Seventy-Two was amended to allow up to 1,000 spectators for outdoor recreational sports, effective immediately. This change advances by two weeks a change that was scheduled to go into effect on May 15 and will allow additional spectators to participate in final games of the current high school sports season and the summer sports season. ● On Saturday 4/24 Hopewell will host a 500 shot Moderna vaccination clinic at 315 Cavalier Square (Gordman’s). This will be a Hopewell Prince George Clinic. 4/23/21 ● The “Educate Vaccinate” group under contract with VDH went door to door encouraging people to go and register onsite at the vaccination clinic today at Gordman’s. Their outreach efforts included The Summit, Twin Rivers, and the neighborhoods directly adjacent to Cavalier Square. 4/23/21 ● Next week Crater Health District has tentatively planned mobile clinics at 100 Kippax on Wednesday from 1:00-4:00 pm , and Davisville/Bland Court on Friday from 1:00-4:00 pm. Personnel from Educate Vaccinate will be helping to market these events in their respective neighborhoods. 4/23/21. ● Hopewell hosted a Pfizer vaccination clinic today. 462 doses of Pfizer were administered today. 4/23/21 ● On April 22nd, Governor Northam announced changes to COVID-19 restrictions starting May 15th these include the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ <u>Social gatherings</u>: The maximum number of individuals permitted in a social gathering will increase to 100 people for indoor settings and 250 people for outdoor settings. This was a combination first and second shot clinic. 580 doses of vaccine were administered. 4/16/21 ● The CDC and the FDA put a temporary halt on Johnson and Johnson vaccine while several rare case of blood clot development after vaccine administration are investigated. 4/16/21 ● Governor Northam announced that the entire State is going to Phase 2 on April 18th. This then includes anyone over the age of 18. 4/9/21 ● Hopewell will be hosting a 2nd shot Pfizer event on Friday April 16 from 9:00 AM until 2:00 PM at 315 Cavalier Square (Gordman’s Building). This event will also include 300 J&J doses for first timers. Residents can call the Hopewell Call Center to register at 804-541-2391. 4/9/21 ● Hopewell will be hosting a 2nd shot Pfizer event on Friday April 23 from 9:00 AM until 4:00 PM at 315 Cavalier Square (Gordman’s Building). This event will also include 723 J&J doses for first timers. 4/9/21 ● A 1,000-dose Johnson & Johnson vaccination clinic serving Hopewell, Prince George, and Dinwiddie, was hosted today at 315 Cavalier Square (Gordman’s building) from 0900-1600 4/9/21 ● The Crater mobile clinic came to 3105 Old Iron Ct. This is a Crater Health testing event. Pre-registration is required by calling 804-862-8989. 2/9/21 • Participated in a statewide vaccination support call hosted by VDEM. They key take-aways are as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ A new vaccine dashboard (see above) was launched today, enabling more transparency about where the state is in the vaccination process. ○ The state is currently averaging 26,000 vaccinations a day. ○ The next goal is 50,000 doses a day, but is subject to supply, which is dependent completely on the Federal government, who has indicated that they can do some limited ramp up of supply to states immediately ○ All skilled nursing homes should have vaccinations complete by February 8th through the federal contract with CVS and Walgreens. 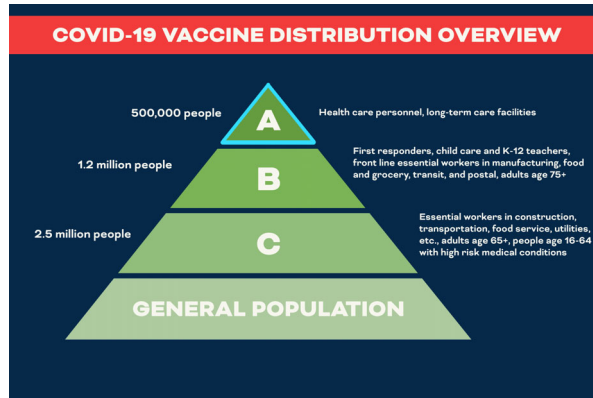
